The Local History Archives are being maintained by an Archives Librarian and a part time Docent provided by a local assistance program.

In 2007, the policies governing the Archives were re-written by the Board of Supervisors. Copies are available on the Library's website and in the Archives. Patrons are asked to adhere to those policies.

Research:

Staff research assistance is provided in a strict by-date basis. Local patrons are not given priority. Research fee schedule is available upon request.

Patrons wanting extensive assistance are encouraged to use a fee-based researcher. A list of local researchers with their fees, is available in the Archives.

HISTORY OF THE ARCHIVES

Yuba County Library's Local History Archives was established in 1906, when the Packard Library building at Fourth and C Streets was opened.

Up to 1959, volunteer Earl Ramey kept the collection in order, as well as developing the **Ramey File**. The Ramey File is a card catalog index to the local newspapers and City Council Minutes, as well as some of the county histories. Patrons can use the file to locate articles on persons, locations and events. The File covers 1846 to 1960. We have started compiling an index to the local newspaper obituaries 1961 to the present. We are currently "in" 1964. The Archives houses the **local newspapers** on microfilm.

The Archives also holds items such as **Marysville School District registration cards** for 1909 to 1967. An Index is in production.

The Archives hold over 2900 **photographs**. An Index is available in the Archives, as well as the albums. Scans of photographs are available (see Order form).

The City of Marysville placed the original **Block/Plat Books** (1853 to 1964) and **Assessor Rolls** (1855 to 1972) in the Archives. No Index is currently available.

The Archives hold a large collection of **maps**. These are in the process of being scanned. Scans are available (see Order form).

Two **Microfilm Scanners** are available for patron use. To have a quick training ses-

sion on the Scanner and Computer please ask. Patrons can print or save to a Flash Drive. See Fee schedule for details.

Currently no **Photocopier** is available in the Archives. Patrons can order photocopies of materials in the collection to be mailed to them or picked up at a later date. See order form.

The Archives' book holdings can be seen via the Library's **Online Card Catalog**. Patrons can access the OCC via the library's website (see below) or at designated computers at the library. 2 Computers in the Archives also provide access to the OCC.
